2025 Adventure #2: Paris and the Île de France: Crucible of Creativity

Dates (tentative): September 9-October 2 2025 (includes travel from and to Canada)

Group Leaders: Brett Bowen and John Black.

Location: Seine-Port, in the Île de France, is about 30 minutes by train south of Paris. Learning activities, and accommodation for up to 9 participants, will be provided in the 18th-century manor house, recently renovated to contemporary standards, pictured herein. Others will be housed nearby in accommodation of similar quality.

Themes: The Adventure will revolve around the immense contribution of Paris, and France generally, to some of the most significant developments in European culture. Through presentations, discussions and visits to important sites in Paris and elsewhere, we shall explore through the lens of history such fields as music, Gothic architecture, painting and sculpture from the late 18th to early 20th centuries, and the successive varieties of social and political organisation adopted by France during this period, along with the ideas that inspired them. Special (but not exclusive) attention will be paid to the Revolutionary and Napoleonic periods.

Group Leaders



John Black has MAs in Philosophy from Cambridge and Simon Fraser, and a PhD from the University of British Columbia. He taught for twenty-four years in the interdisciplinary Liberal Studies BA program at Vancouver Island University, and led study-abroad trips to Europe for twenty years before retiring in 2017. He has a special interest in the way developments in French artistic expression during the 19th century reflect transitions in political thinking and practice during that period.

Brett Bowen (B.A., B.Ed., M.Sc.) received the Alberta Award for

Excellence in teaching and the provincial award for contributions to Gifted and Talented Education as a Calgary Board of Education secondary school teacher. After retiring, he moved to Vancouver Island where he paints and engages in outdoor pursuits (primarily kayaking and cycling). Brett has taught for VIU Elder College for over a dozen years and has spoken to a wide variety of audiences about the impacts of history on today's world.



Inclusive Packages

Package costs include program overheads, accommodation in Seine-Port (as well as near Charles de Gaulle airport on arrival and before departure), minibus rental, train and metro fares, tourist guides, educational materials and activities, and admissions to all cultural sites and events. Participants must arrange their own air travel to Charles de Gaulle and travel insurance, including medical. Food is not included, but the accommodation in Seine-Port has a large kitchen (so that food costs may be minimised), as well as fast wifi and a washing machine.

Shared Accommodation (two people sharing a bedroom): included in program fee.

Payment Schedule

In order to allow us to make a firm decision to proceed with the Adventure, which depends upon enrolment, and to make timely bookings for accommodations etc., it is essential that we are able to cover our overheads well in advance of leaving Canada. The following payment schedule is therefore necessary:

On application, commitment fee of \$500 Due January 15, 2025: booking deposit of \$3000 Due June 15, 2025: payment of remaining balance

Please note that all payments are non-refundable, except in case of cancellation of the program by Adventures in Mind. Late applicants may be allowed some leeway from these deadlines.

Air Travel

Participants must arrange their own air travel to and from Paris Charles de Gaulle (CDG), but **should not do so until they receive official word (probably in February 2025) that the Adventure will proceed**. Before departure you will be given instructions on getting to the hotel on arrival at the airport.

Travel Insurance

All participants are required to have travel medical insurance and are strongly advised also to obtain coverage for trip cancellation and interruption. **Please do not buy insurance until the Adventure has been confirmed.**

Important Notice

A level of physical and mental fitness is required to get the most out of the Adventure. Some of the sites visited are accessible only on foot (some may not be wheelchair-accessible), and some visits may require moderately lengthy periods of walking and standing. On arrival and departure you will have to carry your own luggage.
